The KES released a statement about the accident and a proper explanation of epilepsy and PWE which increased awareness of epilepsy and understanding of PWE in the right direction.

Furthermore, we were able to solve a prescription limitation problem of SSRI antidepressant for PWE with international cooperation from 38 countries. So I greatly appreciate colleagues in other countries and I believe more intimate international network among epileptologists will improve the environment for PWE in all countries of the World.

Seoul is a lively metropolitan area in Korea and the cornerstone to the vibrant culture that exists in the country. The personality of the Seoul can be described as independent, confident, smart, creative, and sincere which I believe makes this city such an ideal place to hold our congress. I hope that all of you will come and sense these aspects of Seoul during your stay.

We invite you to attend and sincerely hope that you will enjoy your time, not only to enrich the specialty of Epilepsy, but also to develop ties and friendships. With high expectations to present you with the most memorable congress, we are very much looking forward to your presence in Seoul in June, 2017.

The Korea Epilepsy Preceptorship Program (KEP Program) provides those who are studying in the field of epilepsy, including residents and fellows, with the opportunity to enhance their skills and knowledge through specific topics. The 2017 KEP program consists of two sessions, 'Ictal semiology & EEG: Electro-clinical correlation' and 'Update in Pharmacotherapy & epilepsy surgery'. This educational program is organized for adult and pediatric epilepsy as an integrated half-day course.

The KEC 2017 is an international meeting and exhibition for those who share the common scientific and clinical interests of epilepsy, clinical neurophysiology and the associated social issues. The meeting offers high-quality educational content across diverse work settings, professional roles and experience levels. There are several categories of comprehensive program:

Plenary & Presidential Symposium - Provide the major impact on the activities at KEC 2017. Topics range from more complex, cutting-edge topics combining basic sciences to practical approaches on clinical epileptology.

Special Interest Groups (SIGs) - Offer a less formal opportunity for attendees with similar interests to explore specific topics [Basic Neuroscience (SIG 1 & 2), Surgical case presentation & discussion (SIG3) & New skills on the analysis of epileptiform discharges (SIG4)]. Although the sizes of SIG sessions vary, all incite themselves to active participation and dialogue.

Teaching Sessions - Review of the science underlying the topics, reviews of essential clinical practice and discussion of the associated clinical implications using a mixture of educational lectures, clinical vignettes and case presentations.

Parallel & Satellite symposiums - Cover the major educational activities at the KEC 2017. Topics range from clinically oriented presentations reviewing common issues in epilepsy to more complex topics combining basic sciences and clinical neurology and neurosurgery.

Special Session for Trainers, Observers & Health-Care Workers - Offers invaluable teaching programs on basic knowledge on general epilepsy & electrophysiological diagnostic tools. Whether you are just beginners or have a limited background in epilepsy, you will find sessions and content relevant to your needs and interest on it.

SEOUL KOREA

Seoul is the capital and largest metropolis of the Republic of Korea (commonly known as South Korea), forming the heart of the Seoul Capital Area, which includes the surrounding Incheon metropolis and Gyeonggi province, the world's 16th largest city. The Seoul Capital Area houses up to half of the country's population of 50.22 million people with 678,102 international residents. Situated on the Han River, Seoul's history stretches back more than two thousand years when it was founded in 18 BCE by Baekje, one of the Three Kingdoms of Korea. It continued as the capital of Korea under the Joseon Dynasty. The Seoul Capital Area contains five UNESCO World Heritage Sites: Changdeok Palace, Hwaseong Fortress, Jongmyo Shrine, Namhansanseong and the Royal Tombs of the Joseon Dynasty. Seoul is surrounded by mountains, the tallest being Mt. Bukhan, the world's most visited national park per square foot. Modern landmarks include the iconic N Seoul Tower, the gold-clad 63 Building, the neofuturistic Dongdaemun Design Plaza, Lotte World, the world's second largest indoor theme park, Moonlight Rainbow Fountain, the world's longest bridge fountain and the Sevit Floating Islands. The birthplace of K-pop and the Korean Wave, Seoul received over 10 million international visitors in 2014, making it the world's 9th most visited city and 4th largest earner in tourism.
